BCA continues to excel in the Science Talent Search

As reported last month, BCA recently had tremendous success in the Regeneron Science Talent Search (formerly sponsored by Intel) with eight semifinalists and two finalists. I'm proud to share with you the following data regarding our school's research program. Between 2002 – 2010, BCA had seventeen semifinalists and one finalist. Since 2011 we have had forty-two semifinalists and eight national finalists. BCA is one of only five schools in the country to have at least two finalists this year. Congratulations to the students and teachers whose hard work has led to these amazing results.



Hot Mikado

On March 3rd and 4th, BCA presents its annual musical with a cast, orchestra, crew and production team comprised of students from multiple academies. This year it's the jazz musical Hot Mikado about a town where flirting is punishable by death and laws seem to be arbitrary.

The show has an interesting history that was actually one of the influences for our choosing to do it. Hot Mikado is adapted from the 1885 operetta written by Gilbert and Sullivan. The famed duo aimed to satirize and mock then-contemporary prudish Victorian morals and attitudes (i.e. a town where flirting is punishable by death and leaders make rulings without much thought). In order to do this, they chose to safely distance themselves from 19th -century England and so the exotic, Japanese inspired world of The Mikado was born.

In the 1930s, two all black productions played on American stages - The Hot Mikado and The Swing Mikado - both updating the score and setting.

All three productions, by today's standards, perpetuated racial stereotypes. In the casting of the original The Mikado, with white actors cast in Asian roles, the unfortunate act of 'yellow face' occurred. In creating worlds built on ethnic clichés and cultural misconceptions, the productions entertained audiences at the expense of offending racial sensitivities.

In the 1980s, writers David H. Bell and Rob Bowman created a new piece that looked beyond the attachment to one nationality or culture. Rather, the team wanted to honor the greatest assets of this piece - the music and the fun and the gentle commentary on a political system run afoul. Though still technically set in Japan, they adjusted the character breakdowns to encourage multicultural casting, in addition to further updating the musical styles and the design choices to create a truly diverse production: Hot Mikado.

The music and overall fun of Hot Mikado are what first appealed to me as a director. But as an educator, the history of the original production and its evolution provided a unique opportunity to discuss and examine the ideas of cultural appropriation and race in casting. This inspired me to choose Hot Mikado for this season's musical.

In a similar vein, I also find the show to be incredibly timely. In a world where "whitewashing" still occurs, with Caucasian actors cast in specifically minority roles on stage and on screen, Hot Mikado's history and diversity offer a wonderful counterpoint to the standard.

So come join us and enjoy the topsy-turvy world of this musical We hope that it inspires not only joy but provocative discussion.

Performances are Friday, March 3rd at 7:30pm and Saturday, March 4th at 2:30pm and 7:30pm. Tickets may be purchased online at www.bergen.org/theatre and are \$15 for adults and \$12 for students and seniors. Tickets may also be purchased at the box office prior to the performance.
