The itinerary will include a tour of our state of the art labs as well as an opportunity for our own students to see and hear research presentations as well as present their own

research through poster presentations and oral presentations. We are currently working on securing a local college or university partner and will provide further details in the near future. This is a great way for students to get to practice presenting their research in preparation for the Intel and Siemens competitions. We will also be highlighting our partnership with the National Park Service and our school's work to create a virtual reality experience at Ellis Island. I am looking forward to the opportunity to highlight BCA as well as watching our students interact with other top students from across the nation.

Through music, dance, song and the most elaborate use of design technology ever undertaken at BCA we are working tirelessly to bring a fresh approach to Webber and Rice's sung-through rock opera. The pleasure of working on a production as complex as this one is rooted in the process of collaboration; each student has been asked to engage. My own memories of performing in high school musicals was one of blissful compliance - waiting to be told what to do, where to move, how to sing and what to think. Here at BCA, surrounded by passionate and intelligent kids, we work in an atmosphere of intense questioning, deep research, experimentation and meaningful collaboration.

But it's not how we do things at BCA and this show continues to demand on every level. We question every lyric, make choices about each step and agonize over every choice. 
