"Speaking with young people about school violence"

Speaking with young people about school violence

Unfortunately, we have seen yet another school shooting occur in our nation and young people are saying "enough." As a school administrator and parent, I realize that this issue affects our young people in many ways. Recently in a meeting with our Student Council, I asked the students gathered whether they usually feel safe here at school and many replied that they did. I then asked them "How do you feel since the most recent school shooting?" and one boy replied "scared – I realize that this kind of thing could happen anywhere." I ask that all parents and guardians spend time discussing with your children how they are dealing with the news of school violence and remind them to share with you any potential threats that they see posted on social media. I also encourage parents to discuss with your children the consequences of making any type of threat in light of recent events. As seen in the news recently, several schools have been closed due to threats on social media made by young people. It is important to discuss that these types of threats are taken very seriously and that students should think twice before posting anything of a suspicious nature. We will continue to work together to make our schools as safe as possible and continue to dialog with students in an effort to minimize school violence in all schools.

Students and Teachers host our first BCA Flash Event

Thank you to all of our students and teachers who worked collaboratively to host our first BCA Flash recently. Academy students presented classes and workshops in a variety of topics from Culinary Arts and Coding to Robotics. This event offered an opportunity for over 150 middle school students from throughout Bergen County to learn from Academy students who are passionate about their subject matter. Students spent the day meeting other middle school students, taking part in several courses and having lunch with

new friends. Our BCA teachers and parents supervised this student-driven event, which from all accounts was a great success. Thank you to everyone involved!

Music Department News!

Winter has been full of student activities in music. We recently had auditions for honors ensembles (county, regional and all-state band, orchestra and guitar ensemble). BCA students earned 35 seats, plus an additional seat for a student who just performed with All-National Orchestra.

Three class of 2020 BCA students formed a piano trio that competed as NJ finalists for the Chamber Music Society of Lincoln Center. We recently went to Rutgers University to perform and hoping to hear good news soon- finalists concertize at Alice Tully Hall.

The "maker" music scene has been abuzz with music activities. **Students in Musicians Workshop** are in the finishing stages of building 2 mandolins. **Students in Senior Music Seminar** have each built an electric guitar as a capstone project. They learned some practical hands-on skills and explored sunburst finishing. Students in another section of M/W are building an overdrive effect pedal. In addition to soldering a circuit board and a bunch of point-to-point wiring, they have drilled and powder coated their own enclosure. Powder coating uses an electrostatic charge to attract powdered epoxy, which is then cured under heat to rock hardness. We have a new project in which students design and build outdoor wind chimes. They have been applying physics and acoustics to measure and tune the chimes, and designed the wood materials from selected hardwoods.

Don't miss our very own pit orchestra performance for the musical **Mystery of Edwin Drood**. Concerts take place on March 1, 2, and 3. BCA is one of the few schools to have its orchestra comprised almost entirely of students. The pit orchestra is a 2x winner of the Metro Awards. Drood is a British musical, murder mystery. This show is particularly interesting because the audience gets to vote for the final outcome, so the show has a different ending at each performance!

On **Sunday, March 11** students from BCA will perform for the community at Ensemble Prestige. This is a concert for soloists and small chamber ensembles. We will also feature a performance of the very first BCA Composition Contest. Aristotle Kolefas will premiere his work "Tarantella Fuocoso". The free concert will be held at Teaneck Public Library at 3pm.

On **Tuesday, March 13** the seniors in the AVPA-Music program will present their Senior Recital. The concert is completely planned and run by the students. As their advisor, I can say that the talent and maturity of the students will shine on stage that evening. **The free concert will begin at 7:00pm on March 13, with a snow date of the 19th**.

BCA SkillsUSA diaBEATit Project

Three juniors in the Academy for Culinary Arts and Hospitality Administration, have been working to raise awareness for diabetes and healthy eating as a part of SkillsUSA.

SkillsUSA is a national club that promotes career and technical education through the development of personal, workplace and technical skills grounded in academics. Students from across the US compete in a wide variety of technical and career skill-based competitions.

Within this club, the three juniors are competing in the **Community Service** competition, where the goal is to perform community service activities for any one cause of the team's choice. Taking into consideration that they are in ACAHA, these juniors chose to raise awareness for diabetes, in combination with healthy eating, through the project they are calling diaBEATit. The main components of this competition for the students have included an active presence on Youtube and Instagram, as well as presentations to the community. The Youtube account features cooking videos of healthy and easy to make foods, along with other videos. The Instagram account keeps followers updated on the team's current activities and includes posts that alert followers of any new videos posted on Youtube. Within their community, the students have presented at Demarest Middle School, Harrington Park Middle School, and a BCA's SkillsUSA club meeting to educate other students on diabetes and healthy eating. While raising awareness, one interesting video that the students have done is a challenge called the diabeatit.bca challenge. By following a strict diet, the three juniors attempted to get a glimpse of what living with diabetes is like. The rules of the diet were eating all three meals in the day, having a protein in each meal, extremely limiting processed foods and processed sugars. The complete process was documented in a video, which can be found on their Youtube channel. With each of the community service efforts, these students work to raise further awareness for diabetes within their communities. 




