“From BCA student to Bronze Star recipient - a story of determination”



From the Principal's Desk

BCA Alum, Dr. Gregory Freisinger, recently returned to speak with AEDT students about his career in the army and his involvement in research since graduating in 2002. Greg's career in the military starts with a story

involving BCA's second floor cafeteria. In an article from Ohio State University Greg told the following story "When I was in high school I thought a little bit about joining ROTC or going to West Point. Both my grandfathers served in the military and it just seemed like it was something I would be interested in. I grew up in northern New Jersey about 10 miles from the George Washington Bridge, so from my high school (BCA) you could see the smoke from the World Trade Center on 9/11, which made me start thinking more about joining the service. I ended up doing ROTC at Georgia Tech for four years, then decided to join active-duty and in 2006 I commissioned as an Army Engineer Officer. I was selected to go to Ranger School and Sapper School following Engineer Officer Basic Course, and was later stationed in Hawaii, where I met my wife who was also an Engineering Officer. Greg would go on to spend four years as an officer with the U.S. Army's 84th Engineering Battalion, during which he took part in a humanitarian mission in Thailand and earned a Bronze Star for his actions in Operation Iraqi Freedom. Because of his military service and commitment to academic excellence — he recently earned his Ph.D. in Biomechanical Engineering at The Ohio State University and was named a Pat Tillman Scholar -- Greg recently accepted a position as a Davies Fellow and is an Associate Professor in the Mechanical Engineering department at West Point. "It's a three-year position where I teach dynamics at West Point and do biomechanical research with the Army Research Lab. I'll be working on researching the effects of powered exosuits on military performance. It's a perfect fit for me and I am excited about continuing my service in a different domain." Greg told the students "looking back,

BCA is a great place but I didn't always think that. When I went to school here we started school at 7:30 a.m. and ended at 4:30 p.m. My friends were taking fewer classes and getting home from their High School earlier. But I don't look back and say I wish I worked less. There were certainly kids at BCA who were smarter than me but I was determined to succeed and my hard work paid off.

Closing the Excellence Gap Summit

I recently returned from Washington D.C. where I visited congressional offices with fellow executive board members of the CLASS coalition (Coalition of Leaders for Advanced Student Success). I also attended the "Closing the Excellence Gap Summit" sponsored by the Jack Kent Cooke Foundation which brings school leaders from the nation's best public high schools to D.C. to meet with policymakers, collaborate on innovative ways to help low-income, high-performing students succeed, and develop new strategies to ensure students are prepared for competitive careers after graduation. During the conference, I had the distinct pleasure of introducing Chris Lu, The U.S. Deputy Secretary of Labor, to the audience. I am proud to represent our school community as well as speak on behalf of our nation's youth at events such as these.

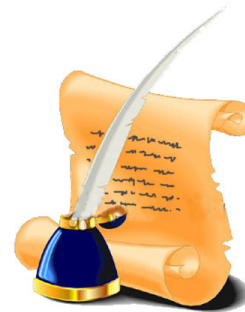

The Relay for Life event will be held at BCA on June 4th and 5th. BCA hosts the Relay fundraiser each year to raise funds for the American Cancer Society. We are very excited about this year's event! A committee of BCA students plans the event, and works in tandem with representatives from the American Cancer Society. Many BCA students have already registered for the fundraiser, and are currently raising money for their teams. In addition to student participation, we encourage BCA families to come and join the fun! Relay will be located on the field behind BCA, and throughout Saturday night there will be ceremonies, activities, walking, and music.

Relay's co-chairs, Megan Pressimone and Meghan Baumbach, are organizing a parent potluck dinner to be available at the event. We would love to have your special recipes! We would love to have parents and families be part of Relay teams this year. Teams participate by walking the track at the event, into the wee hours of the night. For students, parents, and friends, the registration fee for Relay is \$10. Register at http://main.acsevents.org/site/TR/RelayForLife/RFLCY16EA?pg=entry&fr_id=71564. Individuals who pay the registration fee are able to stay until 12 am. Individuals who have fundraised \$100 are eligible to stay the entire night (in tents) on the field in back of BCA. These students will be given wristbands upon registration.

We especially encourage you to bring family members and friends who are cancer survivors, as we honor them at Relay. There is no registration fee for cancer survivors. There is a special ceremony which will honor survivors of cancer at approximately 7 pm on June 4th, and on-site registration is available. A special dinner will also be available to cancer survivors. If someone in your family would like to share a journey with cancer during our Relay ceremony, please let Meghan or Megan know.

In addition to the survivor ceremony and recognition, there is a Luminaria ceremony later in the evening. Luminarias are bags that are lit up around the field the night of Relay, and can be dedicated in honor of individuals. Luminaria forms are attached if you want to dedicate a "light" at the event to someone who has or has had cancer. Completed forms can be sent to Mrs. Wallace at BCA.

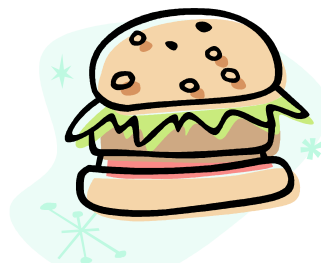

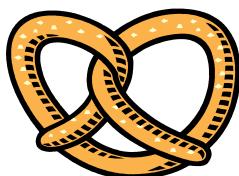
